

Participation Qualifications

- ✓ Must be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America.
- ✓ Must have completed your required training for the positions you are registered in.
- ✓ Be able to meet physical requirements of BSA Annual Health and Medical Record physical in a backcountry environment.
- ✓ Must have Scout Executive approval to attend.

Course Size

The course will consist of at least 32 and *not more than 48 participants*. Once the course is filled, participants will be given the option of being placed on a waiting list in case of cancellations. We must have 32 folks signed up by July 30, 2010 or NO COURSE!

It is important to note that this is a hands-on, intense, early morning to late at night schedule.

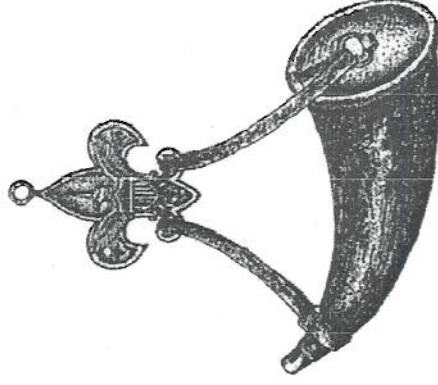

Introduction

Powder Horn is a training opportunity designed to expose the Venturing or Boy Scout Leader to activities and resources necessary to operate a successful high adventure program in several ways:

- ❖ Help Venturing and Boy Scout leaders to safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature.
- ❖ Provide an introduction to the resources necessary to successfully lead their Venturers and older Boy Scouts through a program of high adventure.
- ❖ Familiarize the Advisor with the Ranger program so that he or she can help the Venturer meet the requirements of the **Ranger Award**.

This course is based on the **Ranger Award** requirements giving participants an exposure to outdoor/high adventure activities.

The course will include the following Ranger Award Core Requirements and many of the Electives:

First Aid; Communications; Cooking; Emergency Preparedness; Land Navigation; Leave No Trace; Wilderness Survival; Conservation; Backpacking; Cave Exploring; Cycling/Mountain Biking; Ecology; Equestrian; Fishing; Hunting; Lifesaver; Mountaineering; Outdoor Living History; Physical Fitness; Plants and Wildlife; Project COPE; Scuba; Shooting Sports; Watercraft and Winter Sports.

Learning Objectives

After completing this course participants should have sufficient introductory information that will provide the following outcomes:

- ❖ Detailed knowledge of the **Ranger Award** and associated Silver Award requirements.
- ❖ Knowledge of the health and safety requirements, rules and regulations of the Boy Scouts of America as they apply to outdoor programs.
- ❖ Introduction to the skills necessary to operate their outdoor program and the various certifications necessary and how to obtain those certifications.
- ❖ Knowledge of how to identify local resources and consultants for **Ranger Award** and high adventure activities.

Please Note:

This course is not a total training program, which will enable the adult leader to be an expert or even self-sufficient in any aspect of outdoor skills. Many leaders will most likely still need knowledgeable, trained and certified individuals (consultants) to help provide a safe and correct outdoor/high adventure program.
